We would like to begin by acknowledging that the UBC Vancouver campus is situated on the traditional, ancestral, unceded of the xʷməθkwəyəm (Musqueam). These lands have always been a place of learning for xʷməθkwəyəm youth, who were instructed in their culture, history, and tradition, and who in turn shared their knowledge with a new generation. We also acknowledge the unceded, traditional, and ancestral territories of Skwxwú7mesh(Squamish), Səlilwətaʔ/Selilwitulh (Tseil-Waututh), Syilx (Okanagan) people where other UBC Campuses are located.

This national statutory day provides an opportunity for people to recognize and commit to reconciliation and ensure that the tragic history and ongoing legacy of residential schools is never forgotten.
